## Neptune Beach Selected for an APA Florida Award of Excellence in the Best Practices Category

The City of Neptune Beach: A Model City for Inclusive Planning and Coastal Resiliency Through Vision Planning and Responsive, Innovative Policies

**TALLAHASSEE, FL** – The **American Planning Association, Florida Chapter**, announced that the City of Neptune Beach has been selected for an APA Florida **Award of Excellence** in the Best Practices category. Nominations were received from communities across Florida, but the APA Florida Awards Committee found Neptune Beach's nomination worthy of the premier award.

The nomination titled, *The City of Neptune Beach: A Model City for Inclusive Planning and Coastal Resiliency Through Vision Planning and Responsive, Innovative Policies*, was selected for its innovative and resilient approach to engaging residents.

Beginning in January 2020, the City's consultants, Dover, Kohl and Partners, along with City Staff, engaged residents through multiple forms of community collaboration and outreach. These engagement activities included: design charettes, roundtable discussions, stakeholder meetings, interactive workshops with live polling, open design studios, neighborhood level planning, and even collaboration with Duncan Fletcher Middle School Students.

The process was quickly adapted to the challenges brought forward with the pandemic, and staff embraced new virtual technologies to continue to engage residents throughout the process. As restrictions were lifted, the process continued under a hybrid of virtual and in-person activities.

Neptune Beach Mayor, Elaine Brown, said, "This is a great honor for our City and was made possible due to the diligence of staff, residents and the City Council. We are so proud to have a vision that can serve us as we plan for the future and appreciate the participation of residents during such trying times."

City Representatives will officially receive the award during an Awards Ceremony at the Florida Planning Conference on September 1<sup>st</sup>. The City of Neptune Beach joins previous award winners such as the City of Bradenton (*Creating Together; Youth-Centered Planning for the Riverwalk East Master Plan*).

Neptune Beach City Manager, Stefen Wynn said, "I'm proud of how quickly our staff and residents adapted to the challenges presented during the pandemic and I'm still impressed with how engaged our Residents were during the entire process. Their feedback was paramount to the City's vision for the future and I'm encouraged with how involved they continue to be."

The City is currently finishing the second phase of a three-phase process: the **Vision Plan**, for which the award is given; the **Comprehensive Plan**, which was transmitted to the state for review earlier this month; and the **Land Development Code** update, with the process beginning later this month. Each phase will include degrees of public participation, but the most intensive public engagement was completed with the creation of the City's Vision Plan.
