COMMUNICATIONS AND CORRESPONDENCE

CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Report City Manager Wynn reported the following:

- He is recommending the millage rate remain at 3.3656 mills. The rolledback rate would be 3.2058.
- He is proposing a 3% rate increase for all full-time employees. This is guided by the union contracts. His salary increase would not be implemented until his one-year evaluation.
- He presented an updated City Organizational Chart, which includes an entire new Mobility Management Department.

Mr. Wynn confirmed Councilor Wiley's question that the City Clerk, City Manager and City Attorney are Charter officers and answer to the City Council. The Organizational Chart shows the layers we have within the City.

Mr. Wynn continued by reporting on the new Mobility Management Department and the Better Jacksonville ½ Cent Sales Tax. It is unlikely that all funds from the ½-cent sales tax will be needed, and even more unlikely that all funds will be expended at the same time. It's more likely that expenditures will straddle FY2021 and the Better Jacksonville ½ Cent Sales Tax will continue to receipt revenues from the City of Jacksonville.

He reported that the surveys for the Community Vision Plan have been received. More than 204 surveys have been taken in. A debriefing has been tentatively scheduled to go over what has been received and the next steps in the Vision Plan process.

VARIANCES / SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS / DEVELOPMENT ORDERS

CDB 20-01,CDB 20-01 - Application for Replat as outlined in Chapter 27, Article 3 of the Unified LandReplat, 1924Development Code of Neptune Beach for William L. and Jamie A. Cissel. The property is
currently known as 1924 Seagate Ave, (RE# 177522-0000). The subject property is located
in the R-1 zoning district. The applicants are requesting to subdivide the existing one parcel
into two parcels.

City Attorney Zachary Roth explained that the minimum lot area within that zoning district is 12,000 square feet with a minimum lot width of 100 feet. Each of the proposed lots would meet that criteria in terms of size. The intention, if approved, is to develop the properties as a single lot. The property has access via recorded access easement and will be served by public water but will continue to use septic tanks which will require approval of the Department of Health. He added his concerns are the recorded access easement and that a large portion of the property is in a flood zone.

Mr. Roth stated that based on those two items he pointed out, the application does not comply with the provisions of the Land Development Code.

Mayor Brown added that the Community Development Board (CDB) approved the application by a 5-0 vote on March 11, 2020.

Councilor Chin questioned if Mr. Roth's concerns were properly communicated to the CDB.

Mr. Roth stated that they were raised as questions under the Code for consideration, but they were not openly discussed.

Applicant, Bill Cissel Mr. Roth administered the oath to the applicant, Bill Cissel.

Bill Cissel, property owner and applicant, stated he would be happy to speak to anyone about the ability to access the lot from Seagate Avenue. He owns the property facing it and would have added access to the new lot as well as the existing lot.

He added that both lots far exceed the 12,000 feet that is required giving them plenty of property from the floodplain, which changes every year. Any mitigation would be addressed on an individual basis with architects and the City. He does not foresee any additional easement requirements or setbacks.

Council discussion included a tentative agreement with the neighbor at 1936 Seagate, utilities, the concerns that the City Attorney discussed and the FEMA permitting process.

Community Development Director Kristina Wright stated that the Coastal High Hazard Areas concern the public use of funds for public roadways so that would not be a concern. The City Code is ambiguous in terms of what constitutes a private road width standard.

Councilor Chin's questioned City's liability for unforeseen flood damage if approved.

Mr. Roth answered that from a legal standpoint, as long as the City complies with provisions of the Code, the City would not be held responsible in the future.

NEW BUSINESS

Jarboe Park Jarboe Park Improvements. Councilor Messinger stated that this is moving Phase 1A forward and then closely behind it, Phase 1B, once the Senior Center has been appropriately relocated to a permanent location. What is being presented are staff recommendations for funding. We should finally be able to break ground in the fall.

Mr. Wynn stated that Staff is recommending moving forward with this funding. The total cost is \$893,508. \$596,258 of that is coming from the Better Jax funds.

At the next workshop, a resolution will be introduced to reappropriate funds as the City is exceeding what has been budgeted for Jarboe Park and the Senior Center.

Councilor Wiley stated that he supports the project but would like to see the parking lot east of the Beaches Chapel Gymnasium utilized.

Councilor Messinger remarked he appreciated the support and there may be an opportunity for more parking in front of the water treatment plant wall.

Councilor Chin agreed with Councilor Wiley's suggestion to keep some of the parking as we are creating a place for people to bring their families and we are moving the parking further away. He added that he had heard concerns from the citizens in Bal Harbour and the additional parking on Bay Street. He stated that this may be something to look consider.

Councilor Messinger remarked there have been discussions with Chief Pike regarding parking controls to manage parking access. He added he doesn't want to limit access to the space, but there needs to be a balance.

Mayor Brown stated that this would be on the next Council workshop agenda.

Call to Order Mayor Brown called the virtual workshop meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and Councilor Wiley led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Brown reported that there had been an outbreak of COVID-19 at City Hall. Everyone has been tested and are working from home to keep things running. We are on our way back on the path to getting back to normal.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- Land Use & Councilor Messinger reported that Jarboe Park is on track. Funding and permitting are in place. A committee meeting will be held the first week in September with grant funding being reviewed.
- Strategic PlanningVice Mayor Jones reported this meeting had been rescheduled for August 19th. This gives& Visioningmore time to develop the agenda and be ready for the survey review of the Vision Plan.
- Transportation & Vice Mayor Jones reported this committee met on August 6th at 9:30 a.m. The committee discussed developing a comprehensive capital improvements plan that would also be included in the updated comprehensive plan. This plan would allocate what we have going on over for the next five years. this will allow us to have really an established set of priorities ranging from everything a water treatment plant, sidewalks, road, paving, maintenance, stormwater system, and have it laid out with funding sources into the future. So at least we have a five-year CIP plan. The other item discussed was a request from the City of Jacksonville, for the intersection of King's Road in Florida Boulevard, to install a similar pedestrian hybrid beacon.

Finance/Boards/Committee Chairman Wiley reported the Finance Committee would be scheduled soonCharter Reviewwith department heads discussing requested budget items.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE

Proposed Ordinance, An Ordinance of the City of Neptune Beach, Florida, Amending Ordinance, Police Pension Chapter 2, Administration, Article V, Employee Benefits, Division 4, Police Officers' Retirement System of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Neptune Beach; Amending Section 2-349.12, Minimum Distribution of Benefits; Amending Section 2-349.25, Reemployment After Retirement; Amending Section 2-349.27, Individual Member Share Accounts; Providing for Compliance with the SECURE Act; Providing for Codification; Providing for Severability of Provisions; Repealing All Ordinances in Conflict Herewith and Providing an Effective Date.

Pension Board Attorney Pedro Herrera explained that this addresses the situation that the Pension Board became aware of. The issue is with respect to the rehiring of the police chief. And so, as a qualified plan, a tax-exempt plan, there are certain requirements that have to abide the Internal Revenue Code. One of them is the in-service distribution requirement. An in-service distribution is when a pension fund makes a distribution of benefits to an individual who is still working in the same position that that they would otherwise be receiving those benefits for. An in-service distribution is not impermissible. However, the regulations provide that the plan must specifically provide, or allow for an in-service distribution.

We need to amend the ordinance in order to provide the ability for an in-service distribution for an individual who separates from service, returns to work and is continuing to be employed by the city in effectively the same position, but still allowed to receive their benefits. We recommend that we amend the ordinance to ensure compliance and make sure that our members not adversely affected.

Councilor Messinger requested City Attorney Zachary Roth would review the ordinance so two attorneys representing two sets of entities would have looked at it.

Proposed Ordinance, Sidewalk Sidewalk Construction Fund. Community Development Director Kristina Wright explained the City has instances where sidewalk sections would not be practical, whether that be for trees or construction or infrastructure improvements. Circumstances can occur that make sidewalk improvements less than feasible or practical. For example, often times situations arise where sidewalks do not exist or where infrastructure needs to be relocated. The strict requirement of the immediate implementation of sidewalks may not offer the solution featuring the best use of public or private resources to create desired sidewalk sections to promote increased walkability. A sidewalk construction fund can provide necessary relief and an alternative for all parties through the inclusion of flexibility that will promote the realization and implementation of a sustainable and efficiently implemented sidewalk network at the most appropriate time. After Council discussion, it was decided that the proposed ordinance would go to the Transportation and Public Safety Committee to have more discussion and questions answered.

Vice Mayor Jones added that this is great for budgeting purposes, but he wants to make sure that the City is referencing the appropriate design standards for sidewalks and is consistent with the Florida Design manual.

ISSUE DEVELOPMENT

Pension Police Officers' Retirement Fund Board Appointment. The fifth member of the Police Officers' Retirement Board is chosen by the four trustees and approved by resolution by Council. The vacancy will be advertised and any applications will be submitted to that Board.

Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy. As required by law, Duval County has updated its county Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS) Plan. This plan is required to be updated every five years, and the amendments are made with input from other governmental agencies as well as the private sector. The Local Mitigation Strategy provides the basis for mitigation planning and the associated grant funding for all of Duval County. A Resolution adopting the county plan is a requirement for Neptune Beach projects to be eligible for mitigation grant funding. A resolution to adopt this plan will be on the September 8, 2020, Council agenda.

Councilor Chin asked what part of the 400-page document we should be paying most attention to.

Grants and Resiliency Coordinator Colin Moore stated part of the document that pertains to any potential grant funding is the project list. This can actually be updated quarterly as this group hasn't been meeting because of COVID-19/. There is an upcoming quarterly meeting and as we get more of our projects shovel ready, we will want to add.

Councilor Messinger commented that he wanted to highlight shovel ready because to get our projects to these programs we need to look at these funding sources.

A resolution to adopt this plan will be on the September 8, 2020, Regular Council meeting agenda.

PUBLIC COMMENT

City Manager Stefen Wynn reported that Chuck McCue had requested to speak at this meeting and did not show up on the attendee list.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mayor Brown commended City staff for their efforts during the outbreak of COVID-19 at City Hall.

Order Mayor Brown called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. and Councilor Chin led the Call/Pledge of Allegiance. Allegiance

Public Comment City Manager Stefen Wynn read into the record an email submitted by Chuck McCue, 1908 3rd Street, Neptune Beach: " This past weekend please saw yet another vehicle crash into the entertainment area known as "The Corner". A vehicle entered the eastern end of Atlantic Blvd and crashed into several cars and came to a stop near Hawkers. I have been worried and out this failing intersection for years. We have seen many high speed crashes into this highly populated area. We have been extremely lucky not to have mass injuries or worse. I think our luck is running out and need to take immediate action to prevent further incidents. I strongly believe a roundabout with a center island would restrict the straight shot into "The Corner" where there are a lot of pedestrians that could be injured. Until the roundabout is built I feel we need a temporary chicane or other solution to reduce speed of out of control vehicles from entering this end of Atlantic Blvd. I truly hope the city takes immediate action to prevent a highly likely tragedy in the future. "

Res, No.Resolution No. 2020-05,
Beach Requesting the City of Jacksonville to Plan and Design Complete Streets
Improvements to Penman Road to Address Pedestrian and Bicyclist Safety, Vehicle
Turning Movements at Vehicle/Pedestrian Conflict Points, Drainage, and Aesthetics.

Mayor Brown explained this a joint resolution with the City of Jacksonville Beach requesting the City of Jacksonville (COJ) retain the monies that had been allocated for Penman Road improvements.

Vice Mayor Fred Jones stated that this is continuing the momentum for the Complete Streets Project. The City adopted a Complete Streets Resolution in September, 2018. This authorized the City to begin looking at complete streets. In the next month, COJ will begin scoring the proposals received for the planning of Penman Road, which will be from Atlantic Boulevard to Beach Boulevard. The Finance Committee of the COJ authorized \$500,000 for preliminary engineering and design. This will provide some consensus for further funding.

Councilor Wiley questioned what the improvements on Penman Road included for Neptune Beach.



Any administrative decision that is made by any city official in the administration or enforcement of this article may be appealed within thirty (30) days to the circuit court.

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-05

COUNCILOR CHIN

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 6-31 REGARDING DOGS ON THE BEACH TO CLARIFY LEASH REQUIREMENTS; CORRECTING A TYPO; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6-31 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Neptune Beach, the City regulates the presence of dogs on the Atlantic Ocean Beach adjacent to the City; and

WHEREAS, in the event that persons having dogs on the beach as permitted wish to swim with such dogs, certain leash restrictions contained in that Section make doing so difficult; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to clarify the leash requirements in such event; and

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Neptune Beach, Florida finds and declares that this ordinance is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens and residents of the City, that it advances a significant and important governmental interest, and that it furthers the City's performance of municipal functions and rendering of municipal services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEPTUNE BEACH, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. Amending Section 6-31 of the City of Neptune Beach Code of Ordinances. Section 6-31 of the City of Neptune Beach Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (a) Dogs are permissible on the Atlantic Ocean Beach adjacent to the city during the following time periods:
 - (1) At any hour from October 1st through March 31st; and
 - (2) During the hours of 5:00 p.m. through 9:00 a.m., from April 1st through September 30th.
- (b) In addition to the above provisions, all owners, custodians and/or persons responsible for and in control of any dog(s) on the beach must comply with following:

- (1) Each such dog must be fastened to a suitable leash of dependable strength not to exceed twelve (12) feet in length and the leash must be held or controlled by that person at all times.
- (2) Any person having a dog on the beach during the above-enumerated hours must carry with and on such person suitable materials and utensils with which to remove from the beach any fecal matter deposited by such dog and must remove any fecal matter immediately upon its deposit by the dog under the person's supervision and control.
- (3) Each such dog must have affixed to its collar a current rabies inoculation tag evidencing the dog has be<u>en</u> properly inoculated against rabies within the past year. The civil penalties for violation of this chapter shall be those set forth in section 6-5.
- (4) If dog and the person responsible for such dog's presence on the beach are in the Atlantic Ocean together, the dog shall be allowed to swim unleashed and then immediately put back on the leash before returning to the beach. This does not include walking the dog in the water.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held or declared to be unconstitutional, inoperative or void, such holding or invalidity shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, and it shall be construed to be the legislative intent to pass this Ordinance without such unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative part therein.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become immediately upon passage by the City Council.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NEPTUNE BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ADMINISTRATION, ARTICLE V, EMPLOYEE BENEFITS, DIVISION 4, POLICE OFFICERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NEPTUNE BEACH; AMENDING SECTION 2-349.12, MINIMUM DISTRIBUTION OF BENEFITS; AMENDING SECTION 2-349.25, REEMPLOYMENT AFTER RETIREMENT; AMENDING SECTION 2-349.27, INDIVIDUAL MEMBER SHARE ACCOUNTS; PROVIDING FOR COMPLIANCE WITH THE SECURE ACT PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY OF PROVISIONS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement

("SECURE") Act, signed into law on December 20, 2019, amended the definition of

"Required Beginning Date" under Section 401(a)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code; and

WHEREAS, amendments to the Plan are necessary to conform the Retirement

System to the requirements of the SECURE Act; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the City of Neptune Beach and Police

Officers' Retirement System has recommended an amendment to the Retirement System

to comply with the SECURE Act; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the Plan is necessary to reconcile existing administrative practice with employment of certain City personnel; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the Plan is necessary to fully define the eligibility rules, value and administration of Plan member share accounts as elected by the police officer union; and

WHEREAS, the trustees of the City of Neptune Beach Police Officers' Retirement

System have requested and approved the amendments provided herein as being in the

best interests of the participants and beneficiaries and improving the administration of the

Fund, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has received and reviewed an actuarial impact

statement related to this change and attached as such; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it to be in the public interest to provide this

change to the Retirement System for its police officers; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Neptune Beach, Florida has determined

that it is necessary to amend the following

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Neptune

Beach, Florida that:

SECTION 1: That Chapter 2, Administration, Article V, Employee Benefits, Division 4, Police Officers' Retirement System, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Neptune Beach is hereby amended by amending Section 2-349.12, Minimum Distribution of Benefits, subparagraph (b), *Time and manner of distribution*, by adding the following underlined language and deleting the stricken through language:

Sec. 2-349.12. - Minimum distribution of benefits.

* * * * *

- (b) *Time and manner of distribution.*
 - (1) *Required beginning date*. The member's entire interest will be distributed, or begin to be distributed, to the member <u>no later than:</u>
 - a. <u>With regard to distributions required to be made</u> to a member who reaches age 70 ½ before January 1, 2020: no later than the Member's required beginning date which shall not be later than April 1 of the calendar year following the later of the calendar year in which the member attains age seventy and one-half (70 ½); or <u>April</u> <u>1 of</u> the calendar year in which the member

terminates employment with the district, whichever is later.

b. With regard to distributions required to be made on or after January 1, 2020 to a participant who reaches the age of 70 ½ on or after said date: April 1 of the calendar year that next follows the calendar year in which the participant attains or will attain the age of 72 years, or April 1 of the calendar year that next follows the calendar year in which the participant retires, whichever is later.

* * * * *

SECTION 2: That Chapter 2, Administration, Article V, Employee Benefits, Division 4, Police Officers' Retirement System, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Neptune Beach is hereby amended by amending Section 2-349.25, Reemployment After Retirement, subparagraph (b), *After normal retirement,* by adding the following underlined language and deleting the stricken through language:

Sec. 2-349.25. - Reemployment after retirement.

- (a) Any retiree under this system, except for disability retirement as previously provided for, may be reemployed by any public or private employer, except the city, and may receive compensation from that employment without limiting or restricting in any way the retirement benefits payable under this system. Reemployment by the city shall be subject to the limitations set forth in this section.
- After normal retirement. Any retiree who is retired under (b) normal (or early) retirement pursuant to this system and who is reemployed as a police officer and, by virtue of that reemployment, is required eligible to participate in this system, shall upon being reemployed, discontinue receipt of benefits. Upon reemployment, the member shall be deemed to be fully vested and the additional credited service accrued during the subsequent employment period shall be used in computing a second benefit amount attributable to the subsequent employment period, which benefit amount shall be added to the benefit determined upon the initial retirement to determine the total benefit payable upon final retirement. Notwithstanding, a retiree who is retired under normal (or early) retirement pursuant to this system and is subsequently reemployed as the Police Chief, and by virtue of such reemployment is permitted to opt out of participation in this system, shall be required to opt out of participation in this

system pursuant to F.S. 185.02(16) and shall continue receiving eligible benefit payments during his period of reemployment. Calculations of benefits upon retirement shall be based upon the benefit accrual rate, average final compensation, and credited service (and early retirement reduction factor, if applicable) as of that date and the retirement benefit amount for any subsequent employment period shall be based upon the benefit accrual rate, average final compensation (based only on the subsequent employment period and not including any period of DROP participation), and credited service (and early retirement reduction factor, if applicable) as of the date of subsequent retirement. The amount of any death or disability benefit received during a subsequent period of employment shall be reduced by the amount of accrued benefit eligible to be paid for a prior period of employment. The optional form of benefit and any joint pensioner selected upon initial retirement shall not be subject to change upon subsequent retirement except as otherwise provided herein, but the retiree may select a different optional form and joint pensioner applicable only to the subsequent retirement benefit.

* * * * *

SECTION 3: That Chapter 2, Administration, Article V, Employee Benefits, Division 4, Police Officers' Retirement System, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Neptune Beach is hereby amended by amending Section 2-349.27, Individual Member Share Accounts, by adding the following underlined language and deleting the stricken through language:

Section 2-349.27. - Individual Member Share Accounts.

- (a) Individual member share accounts. The board shall create individual "member share accounts" ("Share Plan") for all <u>eligible</u> actively employed plan members and DROP participants and maintain appropriate books and records showing the respective interest of each member or DROP participant hereunder. Each member or DROP participant shall have a member share account for his respective share as provided for herein. The board shall maintain separate member share accounts; however, the maintenance of separate accounts is for accounting purposes only and a segregation of the assets of the trust fund to each account shall not be required or permitted.
- (b) These share accounts shall be funded, according to provisions herein, if and when monies become available in accordance with the union contract and state statutes. In accordance with F.S. § 185.35, all annual premium tax revenues received up to \$48,395.90 shall be

used to reduce the city's annual required contribution to the System. Annual premium tax revenues received in excess of \$48,395.90 shall be split 50/50, with 50 percent of the excess used to fund the share plan provided for herein, and the other 50 percent used to reduce the city's annual contribution to the system. Additionally, the portion of the Excess State Monies Reserve in place as of September 30, 2015 (after adjustment for the 13th check benefit provided in Ordinance 2015-06) is equally split between a credit to the Plan's Unfunded Actuarial Accrued Liability and a Share Plan allocation. Accordingly, the Share Plan allocation for this use of the Excess State Monies Reserve is \$115,524.10.

- (C) The supplemental pension retirement benefit shall consist of an individual share account for each active police officer employed by the City on or after September 11, 2019. DROP participants and retirees on such date shall be ineligible for such supplemental pension benefits. On or after September 11, 2019, all active police officers on the City's payroll, or new hires, or who enter the DROP. shall remain eligible for the supplemental pension retirement benefits provided for herein. The supplemental retirement benefit shall be funded solely by premium tax revenues received by the city pursuant to F.S. Chapter 185, as provided for by the City of Neptune Beach. The total initial amount to be allocated to the participants' share accounts as provided herein shall be \$126,120.74, comprised of the \$115,524.10 described in paragraph (b) above, in addition to allocations for fiscal years 2016 through 2018 due to retroactive application of the "Default" methodology pursuant to F.S. 185.35(1). Additionally, \$13,908.10 shall be allocated to the Share Plan for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019. For plan years beginning October 1, 2019 and later, 50% of all premium tax revenues received by the city pursuant to F.S. Chapter 185, in excess of \$48,395.90 shall be allocated to the participants' share accounts as provided for herein. Participants' share accounts shall be credited with premium tax revenues and investment earnings or losses, and interest, and distributed as follows:
- (d) Initial crediting. The share account of each active police officer, excluding DROP participants, on the city's payroll as of September 11, 2019, shall be credited as of that date based on the Plan's definition of Credited Service. Each member who was employed on September 11, 2019 as a police officer, excluding members participating in DROP as of that date, shall receive a portion of the initial allocation of \$126,120.74, based on their Credited Service as a fraction of the total Credited Service of all members eligible for a Share allocation. Additionally, the fiscal 2019 allocation of \$13,908.10 shall be equally allocated to all members eligible for a Share allocation as of September 11, 2019.

- (e) <u>Annual crediting. Effective January 1, 2020, and each January 1</u> thereafter, the share account of each eligible active police officer and <u>DROP participant on the city's payroll as of the preceding September</u> <u>30th shall receive an equal allocation of available Chapter 185</u> <u>Premium Tax Monies. The total amount for allocation shall be 50%</u> of amounts in excess of \$48,395.90.
- (f) Investment earnings and losses. Effective January 1, 2020, and each January 1 thereafter, the share account of each eligible active police officer and DROP participant shall be credited or debited with earnings or losses based upon the amount in the share account at the close of the immediately preceding calendar year at a rate equal to the pension plan's actual net rate of investment return for the preceding plan year. An annual administrative fee may be charged on each January 1 for the costs associated with the administration and operation of a participant's Share Plan account at a rate to be set by the Board of Trustees, however, in no event to exceed one-half (½) of one (1) percent. In the case of a participant who separates from service after January 1, the administrative fee shall be paid on a prorated basis for the partial year of participation.
- (g) Distribution of share accounts. An eligible active police officer, or DROP participant, with ten or more years of continuous service upon termination of employment and eligibility for receipt of pension benefits shall be eligible to receive a distribution of 50% of the balance in his or her share account, together with all earnings and losses credited to the share account through the quarter immediately preceding the date of termination of employment. An eligible active police officer or DROP participant with 15 or more years of continuous service upon termination of employment and eligibility for receipt of pension benefits shall be eligible to receive a distribution of 75% of the balance in his or her share account, together with all earnings and losses and interest credited to the share account through the date of termination of employment. An eligible active police officer or DROP participant with 20 or more years of continuous service upon termination of employment and eligibility for receipt of pension benefits shall be eligible to receive a distribution of 100% of the balance in his or her share account, together with all earnings and losses and interest credited to the share account through the date of termination of employment. No benefit shall be payable to an active police officer who terminates covered employment with less than ten years of credited service. The share account balances of such partially vested, as described herein, and non-vested terminated members shall be redistributed among all eligible participants' share accounts in the same manner as premium tax revenues in the following calendar year. The designated beneficiary of an active police officer who dies shall receive the accumulated total of his or her share account balance, and an active

police officer awarded a disability pension from the Retirement System shall receive the accumulated total of his or her share account balance. There shall be no forfeiture of a member's share account based on the member's death, disability or termination of employment with ten or more years of credited service. Payment of share account benefits shall be by lump sum, which shall consist of the accumulated total balance of the active police officer's share account, or, at the participant's direction, the share account balance may be rolled over to another qualified plan in accordance with applicable Internal Revenue Code provisions and regulations, withan additional final payment made for any amount credited in the year following termination of employment.

SECTION 4: Specific authority is hereby granted to codify and incorporate this Ordinance in the existing Code of Ordinances of the City of Neptune Beach.

SECTION 5: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase of this ordinance, or the particular application thereof shall be held invalid by any court, administrative agency, or other body with appropriate jurisdiction, the remaining section, subsection, sentences, clauses, or phrases under application shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 7: That this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption by the City Council.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE CREATING SECTION 21-26 REGARDING VOTING REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN MILLAGE RATE INCREASES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 200, Florida Statutes, regulates the determination of millage rates for ad valorem taxation; and

WHEREAS, Fla. Stat. §200.001(2) establishes four separate categories of municipal millage rates; and

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that increases in millage rates significantly impact real property owners within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to require a super-majority vote of the City Council to authorize increases in all millage rates over a certain thresshold; and

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Neptune Beach, Florida finds and declares that this ordinance is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens and residents of the City, that it advances a significant and important governmental interest, and that it furthers the City's performance of municipal functions and rendering of municipal services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEPTUNE BEACH, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. Creating Section 21-26 of the City of Neptune Beach Code of Ordinances. Section 21-26 of the City of Neptune Beach Code of Ordinances is hereby created to read as follows:

Sec. 21-26. – Voting Requirements for Certain Millage Rate Increases.

For any millage rate authorized to be charged by the city under Florida law, such rate may only be increased over the rate established for the prior year by an amount greater than one-half (0.5) mill if approved by the affirmative vote of no less than eighty percent (80%) of a quorum of the city council present at the meeting at which the vote is taken.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held or declared to be unconstitutional, inoperative or void, such holding or invalidity shall not affect the remaining portions of

this Ordinance, and it shall be construed to be the legislative intent to pass this Ordinance without such unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative part therein.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become immediately upon passage by the City Council.

Background

Circumstances can occur that make sidewalk improvements less than feasible or practical. For example, often times situations arise where sidewalks do not exist or where infrastructure needs to be relocated. The strict requirement of the immediate implementation of sidewalks may not offer the solution featuring the best use of public or private resources to create desired sidewalk sections to promote increased walkability. A sidewalk construction fund can provide necessary relief and an alternative for all parties through the inclusion of flexibility that will promote the realization and implementation of a sustainable and efficiently implemented sidewalk network at the most appropriate time.

Summary

The attached example code language demonstrates that payment in lieu of construction is permitted when not practical due to existing physical impediments such as grade changes, trees, impending road or right-of-way construction, impacts to the pedestrian network, and/or any other situation that determines that sidewalk construction to not be practical.

The sidewalk construction fund requires applicants to make payment into the sidewalk construction fund prior to the issuance of any permits for the development. The calculation within the ordinance language is determined based on the city's cost per linear foot to install a sidewalk.

Conclusion

Due to situations that arise where the implementation of a sidewalk is not practical and due to the desire to expand the level of walkability throughout the community, staff is requesting the consideration to direct staff to create an action agenda item for the next regular city council meeting to establish a sidewalk construction fund.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 27-479 REGARDING SIDEWALK CONSTRUCTION AND USE REQUIREMENTS: AMENDING REQUIREMENTS **REGARDING OUTDOOR SEATING IN RIGHTS-OF-WAY;** PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT IN LIEU; PROVIDING APPEAL **PROCEDURE**; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 27-479 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Neptune Beach, the City regulates the construction and use of City sidewalks and rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, in the course of conducting its operations, the City has determined that certain modifications are required to such provisions to regulate and finance the installation, maintenance, and use of sidewalks through the City; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to clarify and supplement such provisions; and

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Neptune Beach, Florida finds and declares that this ordinance is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens and residents of the City, that it advances a significant and important governmental interest, and that it furthers the City's performance of municipal functions and rendering of municipal services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEPTUNE BEACH, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. Amending Section 27-479 of the City of Neptune Beach Code of Ordinances. Section 27-479 of the City of Neptune Beach Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) No person shall lay any sidewalk or foot paving on the public rights-of-way of the city without a permit. Sidewalks laid in public rights-of-way shall be a minimum of three (3) feet wide and shall be laid with a slope of one-fourth inch per foot toward the street. Sidewalks, when constructed in front of any high traffic area or driveway apron, shall be at least six (6) inches deepSidewalks shall be provided on one (1) side of residential streets where the average lot width at the street is greater than sixty (60) feet but less than one hundred fifty (150) feet.

(b) Sidewalks shall be provided on <u>one or</u> both sides of residential streets where the average lot width at the street is sixty (60) feet or less<u>as provided in sections (e)-(g)</u> <u>below</u>.

(c)_Access for physically handicapped persons. Sidewalks shall be handicapped accessible.

(d)_Right-of-way/sidewalk lease restriction. Outside seating for restaurants, coffee shops and sidewalk cafes may be operated by the management of adjacent permitted food service establishments, subject to the following provisions:

- (1) The city council shall determine and establish by resolution the charges, terms and termination procedures for right-of-way/sidewalk uses.
- (2) Approval of the proposed right-of-way/sidewalk lease by the city council will be deemed the equivalent of the granting of a permit as subsequent sections state.
- (3) The unenclosed portion of the restaurant or cafe shall be accessory to or under the same ownership or control as the restaurant or cafe which is operated within a totally and permanently enclosed building on the same lot.
- (4) The area of unenclosed, outdoor customer service area of a restaurant or cafe shall not exceed fifteen (15) percent of the total enclosed area of the restaurant or cafe.
- (5) Outside seating within public rights-of-way may be permitted under a renewable annual lease agreement approved by the city council. As a condition of the lease, the owner of such establishment shall agree in writing to maintain that portion of the right-of-way where the outside seating is located. The owner/lessee/lessor of the business establishment and the property owner shall agree in writing to hold the city harmless for any personal injury or property damage resulting from the existence or operation of, and the condition and maintenance of the right-of-way upon which any outside seating is located, and shall furnish evidence of general liability insurance in the amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per person and two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per occurrence with the city as additional named insured.
- (6) Outdoor dining is permitted only where the sidewalk is wide enough to adequately accommodate both the usual pedestrian traffic in the area and the operation of the proposed activity. The outdoor dining area shall leave not less than five (5) consecutive feet of sidewalk width at every point which is clear and unimpeded for pedestrian traffic.
- (7) Outside seating areas shall be defined by an enclosure of at least three (3) feet in height measured from the ground or sidewalk level. Enclosures shall

be designed in compliance with ADA accessibility guidelines and shall provide safe pedestrian access to the public right-of-way and designated parking spaces. Such enclosure may consist of screens, planters, fencing or other similar materials.

- (8) Alcoholic beverages shall not be allowed outside the limits of the outdoor seating area, and measures shall be taken to educate customers of the prohibition of alcohol leaving the premises.
- (9) Alcoholic beverages shall be served with meals only and all sales shall end at 1:30 a.m.
- (10) The hours of operation shall be limited to the open of business to 2:00 a.m.
- (11) No heating or cooking of food or open flames shall be allowed in outside seating areas.
- (12) There shall be no use, operation or playing of any musical instrument, loudspeaker, sound amplifier, or other machine for the production or reproduction of sound in such a manner as to constitute a violation of the City of Neptune Beach's ordinances which regulate noise.
- (13) Lighting to serve outside seating areas shall be white in color and shall not project onto adjacent property.
- (14) The outside seating area shall be designated as a nonsmoking area. It shall be assumed that an outdoor dining area is a privilege and not a right. The city council or designee shall have the right to prohibit the operation of an outdoor dining area at any time because of anticipated or unanticipated problems or conflicts with the use of the sidewalk area. Such problems and conflicts may arise from, but are not limited to, scheduled festivals and similar events, parades, marches, or repairs to the street or sidewalk. To the extent that is possible, the permittee shall be given prior notice of any time period during which the operation of the outdoor dining area will be prohibited.
- (15) As stated in subsection (14) above, outdoor dining permits are to be considered a privilege and not a right. The outdoor dining permit may be revoked by the city council following notice of the permittee. Any lease for the use of the city's right-of-way shall include a provision authorizing the right of city to terminate such lease in accordance with this section. In the event the lease fails to include such a provision, the operation of outdoor dining in accordance with such an outdoor dining permit shall be deemed to grant consent of the applicant to the right of the city to terminate any lease in accordance with this section without the requirement for further amendment to such lease. The permit may be revoked if one (1) or more conditions outlined in this section have been violated, or if the outdoor dining area is

being operated in a manner which constitutes a public nuisance not specifically outlined in the above article. Following the revocation of an outdoor dining permit, no application for the same site shall be filed within one (1) year from the date of revocation.

(16) The community development director, building official, code enforcement officer, or other person authorized by the city manager, shall be authorized to enforce provisions of this section and to take such action as may be necessary to ensure compliance with the regulations, general provisions or conditions imposed upon the outdoor dining permit.

(e) Sidewalks Required. Except as provided otherwise herein, sidewalks shall be required on one or both sides of all streets in accordance with the City of Neptune Beach Sidewalk Plan adopted from time to time by the City Manager or their designee, subject to the following:

- (1) Modification of Sidewalk Location. The Public Works Director shall be authorized to approve or require modifications in sidewalk locations to accommodate unique design characteristics or to protect existing trees or when there is a conflict between the required sidewalk and the provisions of this Code.
- (f) Payment in Lieu of Construction.
 - (1) When Not Physically Practical. Upon request of a building permit applicant, the Public Works Director shall be authorized to determine that construction of sidewalks is not physically practical. Examples of factors that may make sidewalk construction not physically practical include but are not limited to the following:
 - A. Existing physical impediments;
 - B. Substantial grade changes;
 - C. Trees;
 - D. Impending road/right-of-way construction;
 - E. Impacts on pedestrian network; and/or

F. A determination made by the Public Works Director that sidewalk construction is not physically practical.

(2) Sidewalk Construction Fund. If the Public Works Director determines that sidewalk construction is not physically practical, the permit applicant shall not be required to construct sidewalks. Instead, the permit applicant shall make a payment into the Sidewalk Construction Fund to be established by the City prior to issuance of any permit for development of the site. Such payment shall be the equivalent of the per linear foot cost to the City for installing the sidewalk, based upon the usual cost to the City to install sidewalk at such time, using a 6" minimum thickness of concrete for the driveway and a 4" minimum thickness of concrete for the parcel frontage. The

<u>City shall expend proceeds from the Sidewalk Construction Fund for sidewalk</u> <u>construction only.</u>

- (g) Appeals.
 - (1) Any person desiring to appeal a determination issued by the Public Works Director is hereinafter referred to as "Appellant." In order to secure administrative review under this subsection, Appellant must file a written Notice of Appeal with the City of Neptune Beach City Manager within ten calendar (10) days of the decision sought to be appealed. A required processing fee, as established from time-to-time by the City Manager, may be required with the Notice of Appeal in order to defray actual administrative costs associated with processing the appeal.
 - (2) All Notices of Appeal shall include a full explanation of the reasons for the appeal, specifying the grounds therefore, and containing any documentation which the applicant desires to be considered.
 - (3) Within thirty (30) days following the receipt of the Notice of Appeal, the City Manager will review the submitted documents and any other relevant material. The thirty (30) day review period may be extended if additional information is needed from the Appellant in order to render a decision. Upon completion of the administrative review, the City Manager will provide a written response to the Appellant.
 - (4) Appellant may appeal the determination of the City Manager by filing a written Notice of Appeal to City Council. Said filing shall be made with the City Clerk for the City within fifteen (15) days following receipt of the City Manager's determination. All Notices of Appeal to City Council shall include a full explanation of the reasons for the appeal, specifying the grounds therefore, and containing any documentation which the applicant desires to be considered. The appeal shall contain the name and address of the person(s) filing the appeal and shall state their capacity to act as a representative or agent if they are not the owner of the property.
 - (1)(5) The City Clerk is responsible for scheduling the appeal before the City Council and will provide at least ten (10) days' notice to the Appellant of the date of the designated Council meeting. Postponements of the City Council appeal date may be granted by the City Clerk if they are requested in writing at least ten (10) days in advance of the scheduled City Council meeting date. When an Appeal is scheduled before the City Council, the Appellant and the City staff shall each be given five (5) minutes for presentation at the meeting

Section 2. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held or declared to be unconstitutional, inoperative or void, such holding or invalidity shall not affect the remaining portions of

this Ordinance, and it shall be construed to be the legislative intent to pass this Ordinance without such unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative part therein.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become immediately upon passage by the City Council.

Radio Refresh – Critical

Problem & Scope:

The NBPD utilizes a Motorola 800mhz radio system, which is shared by the entire county. This system, officially named the 'First Coast Radio System', has been in existence since 2002. Therefore, the vast majority of the NBPD's radios currently being used are 18 years old. Motorola has recently ended service and repair on these models.

By using grants, the NBPD has slowly been replacing these units with newer models, however an assessment has identified the need for 29 radios, which far exceeds that which is able to be obtained via the extended 'trickle-in' type replacement model. Each Officer requires two radios; one inside his/her vehicle and one portable belt-mounted radio.

Budget Narrative:

Projected NASPO Contract cost for 37 Police Radios - 29 Portables, 8 Mobile ~\$4,000ea Total:

\$152,000.00. (Financing= 2, 3 or 5-year terms, 76k, 52k or 32k per year, see attachment for APR%)

Computer Aided Dispatch Project – CAD (continuation) – Critical

Problem & Scope:

The NBPD began a project in FY2020 to begin integration with the county-wide computer aided dispatch (CAD) system. This system allows our agency to immediately share call information with other responding agencies.

Budget Narrative:

Projected costs over 4 years are \$80,000 for full implantation. Costs have been broken into smaller increments of \$20,000 per year.

TASER Refresh (continuation) – Critical

Problem & Scope:

The NBPD identified the need for a complete refresh of its TASER inventory in FY2019. This funding is a continuation of that project.

Budget Narrative:

NBPD HQ Generator – Critical

Problem & Scope:

During a routine inspection of the department's emergency back-up generator in FY2020, the double-wall fuel tank was found to be defective. Water intrusion from rain runoff has been leaking into the double wall void. This has the high potential to then leak into the diesel fuel chamber causing the generator to fail when needed. The operational reliability of this unit is paramount for hurricane preparedness. In FY2020, an external spare tank was purchased to ensure temporary operation as hurricane season approached. This is not a long-term solution and the tank is not secure or in compliance with Accreditation standards.

Budget Narrative:

1. A new tank to replace the failing one would require a crane to lift the generator off the fuel tank that it sits on. The cost of this process is roughly \$20,000.

2. A new generator is roughly \$44,000.

3. A new generator large enough to power both Police Headquarters and City Hall is roughly \$86,000.

<u>Total:</u>

\$86,000 (to be shared with City Hall)

Building Maintenance – Paint

Problem & Scope:

The exterior of Police HQ is in need of general maintenance.

Budget Narrative:

Paint and replace rotten wood on the exterior of HQ.

Problem & Scope:

The current training room inside Police HQ was built as a remodel years ago. The HVAC system currently installed does not adequately cool the added space, nor has it ever. A window unit was purchased years ago, however even it fails to cool the space.

Install larger unit or increase the size and duct work of the current system. Total: \$4,000,00

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Replacement 4x4 UTV (Mule) – GRANT POTENTIAL

Problem & Scope:

The current UTV vehicle utilized to access the beach is nearing its end-of-life. The vehicle's frame is rusting, and repair costs are becoming cost-prohibitive to maintain the vehicle in the fleet. The UTV is utilized routinely, especially during times that the beaches crowds are excessive and safe operation of a full-sized vehicle is unsafe. The Firehouse Public Safety Grant Foundation and Homeland Security both have grants available for funding sources. Deadlines are rapidly approaching (mid-June 2020)

Budget Narrative:

Projected costs for a new UTV: \$15,000.

The rentals costs have now surpassed the amount required to simply purchase the items on our own. Further, costs could be shared with Public Works, as many uses are applicable to road work and warning messages concerning public works projects.

The purchase of water barricades and an open trailer to carry barricades.

\$42,000.00 (proposal to split costs with Public Works)

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Purchase of Two BWC & In-Car Cameras for DUI Unit

Problem & Scope:

The NBPD currently does not have an active Body Worn Camera (BWC) program. As these devices have become popular throughout law enforcement agencies, one major hurdle preventing our department from the deployment and usage of such device has been the significant investment for software storage and personnel for redaction. The initial stages for implementation are to purchase 4 devices, for each of the DUI Traffic Enforcement Officers to utilize prior to a full roll-out to the rest of the agency.

Budget Narrative:

Axon BWC and In-car Camera system per officer \$7,500.00

Firearms Range Upgrades

Problem & Scope:

The NBPD currently operates a Firearms Range within the City Yard facility. The range is used routinely for qualifications and testing during hiring of new officers. The range has not had any significant improvements made to it for nearly 10 years. The wood wall surrounding the target system needs to be replaced, the pneumatic actioning target system has been non-functional for nearly 8 years and the shade canopy is nearing its end-of-life. Improvements will include replacement and/or repair of existing equipment.

Budget Narrative:

Projected costs to repair pneumatic airlines and broken wood wall: \$1,500. Total:

\$1,500.00

Glock Duty Weapon 9mm Transition Project

Problem & Scope:

This project will allow NBPD to transition from .40 cal to 9 mm for duty weapons. This aligns with other nearby agencies and numerous studies have found the 9mm platform to be superior for numerous reasons from better recoil control to more cost effective when purchasing ammunition. Current weapon inventories can be traded-in for a credit when purchasing new firearms, thus having significant cost savings when refreshing the weapon inventory. Issued duty weapons exceed 15 years of age.

Budget Narrative:

Costs will be nominal due to trade-in credits. Projected cost are \$100 per weapon. Total:

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Bicycle Repair Station – GRANT POTENTIAL

Problem & Scope:

Neptune Beach is heavily traveled by bicyclist, who often time break down and seak police assistance. A bicycle repair station, to be installed in the front porch area of Police HQ, would alleviate this issue. This system will allow any member of the public the ability to repair their bicycles 'on the fly' and in a safe environment.

Budget Narrative:

Purchase and installation costs.

\$1200.00.

Patrol Rifle Refresh – 4 Rifles Per Year

Problem & Scope:

The NBPD's current weapons inventory includes patrol rifles (AR-15 .223 Cal) in excess of 15 years of age. While these weapons are inspected by agency armorers each year, the rifles have surpassed the life expectancy for safe patrol usage. A complete refresh of patrol rifles is needed over the course of 4 years.

Budget Narrative:

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
