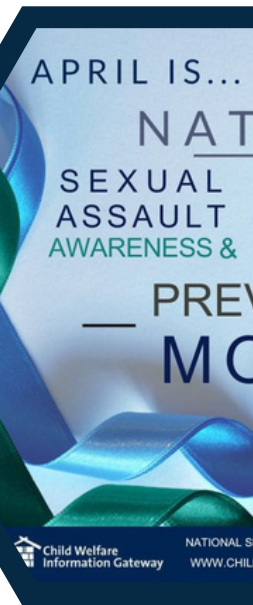

"3 years."


**2. What is a fun fact about yourself?**

## Departmental Activities



Our department is currently working toward implementing Live Scan and Rapid ID fingerprinting technology – two information technology tools to help identify individuals and process new-hire employees. These force multipliers will also help officers combat sex trafficking by the rapid identification of individuals in the field without the need to transport them to a facility with larger fingerprinting devices to obtain their identity. This effort will further ensure the safety of our community and aid officers' efforts in combating a multitude of different crimes.



E-bike safety concerns remain an issue for our community, like many other communities throughout the State of Florida. The City of Neptune Beach currently has a municipal ordinance governing some aspects of e-bikes, such as the prohibition of reckless operation – however – one important aspect not widely known is that the State of Florida preempts local governments from regulating many

aspects of e-bikes. Statutorily speaking e-bikes are considered bicycles by State Law, with a few exceptions. The NBPD has and will continue to conduct enhanced-enforcement campaigns to curb the reckless operation of e-bikes and educate/ticket offenders. As the summer months approach and warmer weather fills in, we are ramping those efforts up even more. We have also visited local schools and provided lectures to students about the law. We have placed several signs along First St. and have plans to strategically place more in other areas of our city. The reality is though, Police Officers cannot be everywhere and even if we could, we need the community to meet us halfway. We need parents to educate their children and we need adults to follow the law. We simply cannot 'police' our way out of this issue – we need our community's help, too.

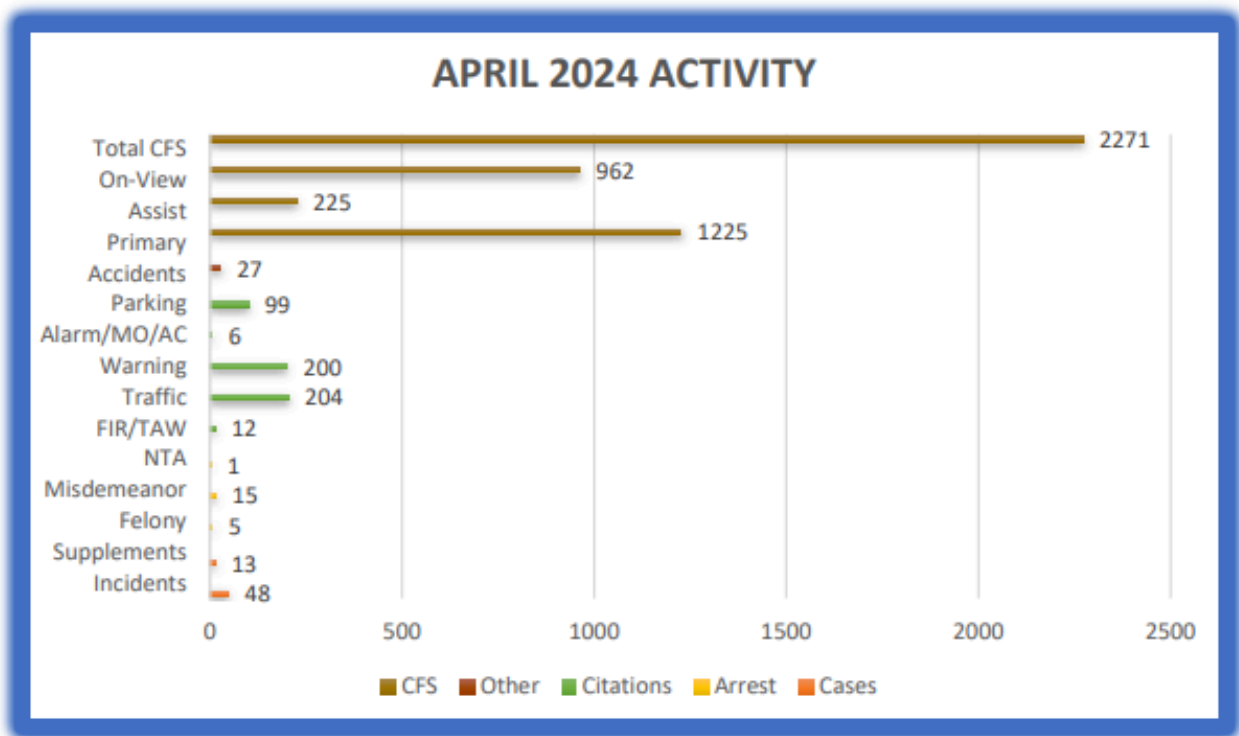

**OFFENSE BY TYPE**



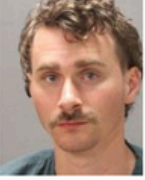

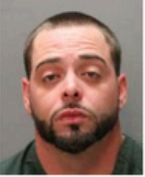

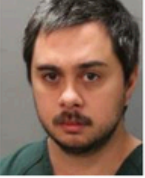
